The same twelve colors identify individual fibers, and they repeat to identify buffer tubes — so in the common 12-fibers-per-tube build, 12 tubes. The standard defines a 12-color sequence that cycles through tubes and repeats for fibers within each tube, allowing unique identification of every fiber in cables up to 288 fibers and beyond. Standard cable construction groups 12 fibers into each buffer tube.
