- Green

- Slate (Gray)
- White
- Red
- Black This sequence is consistent across most manufacturers and is used in both loose tube and tight-buffered cables, including figure-8 aerial cables commonly deployed in outdoor and aerial installations .

- Slack Loops: Maintain proper slack loops at termination points to prevent fiber stress and signal loss .
