

Adding fiber optic switch ports to an existing zone

To add fiber optic switch ports to an existing zone, ensure proper physical connectivity with compatible SFP modules and configure the new ports in the zone while following best practices for defzone policies.

Physical Integration of Fiber Ports

- **Check Fiber Type and Modules:** Identify whether your fiber is single-mode or multimode and select compatible SFP or transceiver modules for both the existing and new switches (). For example, a 10Gb LR transceiver is suitable for single-mode fiber over long distances.
- **Connect the Fiber:** Use proper patch panels and maintain correct polarity. Ensure that the fiber cables are clean, within bend radius limits, and properly labeled to avoid signal degradation ().
- **Configure Trunking if Needed:** If the new switch will carry multiple VLANs, configure the SFP ports as trunk ports on both ends. For a single VLAN, ensure the trunk allows that VLAN and connect all access ports accordingly ().
- **Test the Link:** Verify that the SFP ports are recognized and the link is stable. Use network management tools or switch dashboards to confirm connectivity ().

Zoning Configuration

- **Determine Zone Membership:** Decide whether the new ports will be added to an existing zone or require a new zone. Zones can be defined by port WWN, interface, or switch WWN depending on your SAN switch capabilities ().
