Pigtail

A pigtail is a short fiber optic cable with a factory-polished connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The bare end is typically fusion-spliced to a fiber in a cable or distribution frame, creating a permanent, low-loss connection inside an optical distribution frame (ODF) or terminal box . Pigtails are mainly used to provide a clean, serviceable interface for connecting fiber optic cables to devices or patch panels. They are not intended for direct, reconfigurable connections to equipment.

Jumper Cable (Patch Cord)

A jumper cable, also called a patch cord, is a fiber optic cable with connectors on both ends. It is used for temporary or reconfigurable connections, such as linking devices to ODFs, connecting ODF-to-ODF, or making quick swaps in data centers and telecom networks . Jumpers are flexible and designed for front-side patching, allowing technicians to move, add, or change connections without touching the splices.
