Installation Overview

When connecting a cable tray vertically to a T-junction, the main considerations are structural support, cable bend radius, and smooth transition from the vertical run to the horizontal branches. Typically, the vertical riser extends downward from the main backbone, and horizontal runs branch out at the T-junction using elbows or bends to guide cables safely onto the horizontal tray .

Steps for Proper Connection

- Determine the Layout: Identify the main vertical tray (riser) and the horizontal branches that will form the T-junction. Ensure the vertical run aligns with the intended floor or equipment level .
- Use Elbows or Sweeps: At the junction, install a 45° or 90° elbow to transition cables from the vertical riser to the horizontal tray. This prevents sharp bends that could damage cables and maintains the minimum bend radius required for the cable type .
