

# Cable trays are permitted by national regulations



## Overview

Today, the use and installation of cable trays is covered by Article 392 of the NEC, and by OSHA regulations in 29 CFR 1910. Prohibited Areas: Cable trays cannot be used in hoistways or enclosed spaces and must remain accessible. These systems provide an efficient and adaptable solution for managing a wide range of cables, including power cables, control. The primary rulebook used in the safe use of cable trays is NEC Article 392.
