- **Breaker Selection:** Each branch circuit in the subpanel should have a breaker rated appropriately for the connected load. For example, a 10A breaker protects a 10A-rated circuit .
- **Main Breaker in Subpanel:** A subpanel may include a main breaker to disconnect all circuits locally, but it is not strictly required if the feeder breaker in the main panel provides overcurrent protection .
