Role in Broadband Networks

In broadband networks, especially FTTH (Fiber to the Home) setups, splice boxes serve as intermediate connection points between the main backbone fiber and distribution fibers that reach individual homes or offices . They can accommodate optical splitters to divide signals for multiple endpoints and often include splice trays and protective units for fiber management . However, a splice box does not actively convert optical signals into usable internet; it only provides a passive connection.
