Safety Hazards

Bathrooms are inherently high-moisture environments. Steam, splashes, and condensation can penetrate the panel, causing:

- **Electrocution risk:** Moisture on the panel or floor reduces body resistance, increasing the chance of electric shock.
- **Fire hazard:** Corrosion on terminals and bus bars increases resistance, generating heat that can lead to electrical fires.
