Explosion-proof distribution boxes must meet strict design, material, certification, and installation standards to safely contain internal explosions and prevent ignition of surrounding hazardous atmospheres.

Certification and Standards

Explosion-proof distribution boxes must comply with recognized safety standards to ensure suitability for hazardous environments. Key certifications include ATEX (for EU compliance), IECEx (international standard for explosive atmospheres), and NEMA ratings (for environmental protection and mechanical strength) . These certifications validate that the enclosure can safely contain sparks, arcs, or internal explosions without igniting surrounding flammable gases, vapors, or dust . Compliance with Class I/II Division 1 or equivalent classifications is essential depending on the type of hazardous material present .

Material and Construction

Materials must be robust and corrosion-resistant, typically stainless steel, aluminum, or glass-reinforced polyester (GRP), to withstand mechanical stress and environmental exposure . Enclosures should feature flameproof (Ex d) or increased safety (Ex e) chambers, with appropriate IP ratings (e.g., IP66) to prevent ingress of dust and water . The design must ensure that any internal explosion is contained and vented safely without producing shrapnel .
