- **Cat6, Cat6a, and Cat7:** Support 10G Ethernet and PoE applications. Cat6a is preferred for higher power delivery and reduced interference.
- **Direct Attach Copper (DAC) cables:** Pre-terminated twinax cables for short-range, high-speed connections (10G-100G) between switches.

Compatibility and Modules

Core switches often use SFP, SFP+, QSFP+, or QSFP28 transceivers to interface with fiber or DAC cables. These modules follow multi-source agreements (MSA) for standardization, but using vendor-recommended modules ensures optimal performance and full feature support.
