High ambient temperatures, direct sunlight, or overloading can raise internal temperatures above safe limits, creating a fire hazard . Poor ventilation or blocked airflow exacerbates this risk.

Moisture and Environmental Damage: Outdoor distribution boxes are vulnerable to rain, humidity, and water ingress. If waterproofing is inadequate, moisture can corrode components, cause short circuits, and increase the risk of electrical fires .

Dust and debris accumulation can also compromise safety.

Improper Installation and Layout: Incorrect positioning, chaotic internal wiring, or insufficient grounding can increase the likelihood of electrical faults, short circuits, and operational failures. Boxes installed too high, too low, or near flammable materials pose additional hazards .

Unauthorized Access and Tampering: Children or untrained individuals playing near distribution boxes risk injury. Tampering with boxes can damage equipment, disrupt power supply, and create dangerous conditions .
