

Distance between power cable trays and low-voltage cable trays



Overview

Trays for cables of different voltage levels should be stacked in descending order with the higher voltage. At least 12 inches of clear space should be provided between tray levels. Maintaining proper separation between power, data, and limited energy cabling is foundational to system performance, safety, and code compliance. Separation isn't just an EMI precaution — it protects signaling, reduces rework, and ensures pathways meet inspection expectations across risers. NEC Article 392 outlines the key rules for installing and maintaining industrial cable tray systems. These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety. Below are some common safety spacing requirements: 1. Parallel Wiring of Power and Low Voltage Cables 130mm if. In industrial settings, electrical and instrumentation (E&I) cable trays or bridge racks play a critical role in organizing and supporting power, control, and signal cables across facilities.
