Purpose of Markings

Markings on a distribution box (also called a breaker box or service panel) and its switches serve to identify circuits, indicate electrical ratings, and provide safety information. Clear labeling helps prevent accidental shocks, allows for safe isolation of circuits during maintenance, and facilitates troubleshooting in emergencies or system upgrades .

Common Markings on Distribution Boxes

- **Main Breaker:** Shuts off all power to the system. It is usually labeled clearly as "Main" or with its amperage rating .
- **Branch Circuit Breakers:** Control individual circuits for rooms, appliances, or outdoor areas. Each should be labeled with the area or device it powers, e.g., "Kitchen Outlets" or "Living Room Lights" .
- **Neutral and Ground Bars:** Connection points for neutral (white) and ground (bare or green) wires. These are often marked with "N" for neutral and "G" for ground .
- **Electrical Ratings and Warnings:** Labels may include voltage, current ratings, and cautionary notes about potential hazards, ensuring compliance with safety standards .
