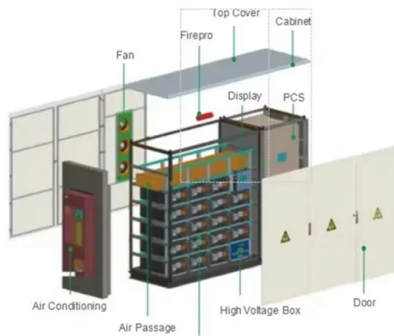

Overview

According to NEC Article 250, neutral and ground wires must remain separate in subpanels. Neutral bar vs grounding bar inside a distribution box, showing the N bar carrying normal return current and the PE bar providing the protective fault-current path. In a service equipment (main panel) and remote distribution panel (subpanel), the ground. Confusion often arises when connecting the neutral and ground conductors within a breaker box, as their proper handling depends entirely on the panel's location within the electrical system. These two conductors serve fundamentally different safety functions, even though they may sometimes connect. A clear breakdown of when grounds and neutrals must be bonded versus separated, why it matters for safety, and what happens when you get it wrong. They should never be connected together downstream of the service equipment, such as in subpanels or other parts of the circuits.
