

Do cable trays and cables need conduit

Tray cables generally do not require conduit when installed in cable trays, but conduit is needed in high-risk or special environmental conditions.

Tray Cable Basics

Tray cables (TC, TC-ER, and similar types) are designed for use in cable trays and can run openly without conduit, provided they are properly supported and protected from excessive mechanical damage. They are multi-conductor cables with robust jacketing suitable for industrial, commercial, and some residential applications, including power distribution, control circuits, and data lines (L-com) . The National Electrical Code (NEC) Articles 392 and 336 allow tray cables to be installed openly in listed cable trays, making conduit unnecessary under normal conditions .

When Conduit is Required

Conduit becomes necessary in specific situations:

- Underground runs where cables are not rated for direct burial.
- High mechanical threat areas, such as exposed walls or areas prone to impact.
- Environmental protection needs, including moisture, chemicals, UV exposure, or rodent protection.
- Transitions, such as when cables drop down walls, cross expansion joints, or pass through fire-rated barriers (CCC Engineering) . Conduit provides additional mechanical protection, environmental isolation, and a neat finish, but it is more labor-intensive and costly than open tray installation (Ned-Tech) .
