

Do cables in cable trays need to be labeled



Summary of Content

Yes, cables in cable trays should be labeled for safety, identification, and maintenance purposes, with high-voltage trays requiring specific warning labels under NEC 392.18(H).

Regulatory Requirements

For cable trays containing conductors rated over 600 volts, the National Electrical Code (NEC) mandates permanent, legible warning labels stating “DANGER — HIGH VOLTAGE — KEEP AWAY” at intervals not exceeding 10 feet (3 meters) along the tray . These labels must comply with NEC section 110.21(B), which specifies that hazard markings must be clear, durable, and use effective words, colors, or symbols to warn personnel . Exceptions exist for inaccessible equipment in industrial settings where only qualified personnel service the installation .

General Cable Identification

Even for lower-voltage or communication cables, labeling is strongly recommended to facilitate maintenance, troubleshooting, and upgrades . Proper labeling ensures that each cable can be traced from origin to termination, reducing errors and downtime. Labels should be durable, legible, and resistant to environmental factors such as heat, chemicals, or UV exposure . Common methods include:

- Printed heat-shrink or wrap-around labels for individual cables
- Cable tags and ties for high-density trays
- QR codes or barcodes for digital tracking and documentation
