Female connectors allow multiple pigtails to be organized and connected via patch cords, providing flexibility and easier management in structured cabling systems .

Choosing the Right Connector

The choice between male and female depends on the intended application:

- **Direct Device Connection:** Use a male connector if the pigtail will plug straight into a transceiver or other active equipment.
