

Does the Ghana Telecom fiber optic cable have grounding



Overview

Our Optical Ground Wire (OPGW) provides a resilient and cost-effective alternative to the buried fibre optic infrastructure of the Telecoms operators. The Transmission line infrastructure is over 5000km with 2500km already equipped with Optical Ground Wire (OPGW). Ghana is connected by at least five undersea cables—SAT-3, MainOne, WACS, Glo-1, and ACE—with Google's Equiano landing in West Africa, linking Ghana to Portugal and South Africa, and the 2Africa cable planned to land in Ghana. Ghana's grid operator alone runs over 2,500 km of optical ground wire, and the 45,000 km 2Africa cable now. The persistent destruction of fibre-optic cables across Ghana has cost telecommunication companies an estimated US\$69. 3 million in repairs over the past five years, raising fresh concerns over the stability of the country's digital infrastructure. Beside the backbone interconnections, MTN and Vodafone Ghana have. The Chamber of Telecommunications has announced a strategic partnership with the Attorney General's Department aimed at securing legal authority through a fiat to prosecute individuals and construction companies responsible for damaging fibre optic cables belonging to telecom operators.
