

# Dynamic Aggregation Switch

A dynamic aggregation switch uses LACP to automatically bundle multiple physical links into a single logical connection, providing higher bandwidth, redundancy, and simplified management.

### Overview of Dynamic Link Aggregation

Dynamic link aggregation, defined under IEEE 802.1AX (formerly 802.3ad), allows multiple Ethernet interfaces on a switch to operate as a single logical link. Unlike static aggregation, which requires manual configuration on both ends, dynamic aggregation uses the Link Aggregation Control Protocol (LACP) to automatically negotiate which physical interfaces participate in the aggregation group, ensuring compatibility and reducing configuration errors .

### Key Benefits

- **Higher Bandwidth:** Multiple physical links are combined, e.g., four 1Gbps links can provide up to 4Gbps total throughput .
- **Redundancy:** If one link fails, traffic is automatically rerouted to remaining links without disruption .
- **Load Balancing:** Traffic is distributed across aggregated links using algorithms based on source/destination MAC or IP addresses .
- **Simplified Management:** Aggregated links are treated as a single interface, making monitoring and configuration easier .
