Fiber optic cables are sensitive to excessive pulling, bending, and crushing, which can degrade transmission performance over time.

Installation Practices

Trenching and Plowing: Direct-buried fiber optic cables are typically installed using trenching or plowing methods. Trenches must be free of sharp rocks and debris, and the cable should be laid without exceeding the maximum tensile load specified by the manufacturer . **Depth Requirements:** Industry best practices recommend burial depths based on location and risk factors :

- Residential/Commercial Areas: 24–36 inches (60–90 cm)
