Fusion splicing is the most common method for connecting a pigtail to a fiber cable. The process involves:

- Stripping the protective coatings from the fiber to expose the bare glass.
- Cleaning the fiber with alcohol wipes to remove contaminants.
- Cleaving the fiber to create a flat, perpendicular end-face.
