What Hot Standby Means

In a hot standby configuration, the backup Firebox or distribution unit is continuously powered on and synchronized with the primary device. This ensures that if the primary unit fails, the backup can take over almost instantly, minimizing downtime and maintaining network continuity . Unlike cold standby, which requires manual activation and may involve data restoration delays, hot standby is designed for high-availability, mission-critical environments .

How It Works in Fire Distribution Boxes

- **Active/Passive Setup:** Typically, one Firebox acts as the active master, handling all traffic, while the second Firebox is the passive standby, ready to take over .
- **Automatic Failover:** If the active Firebox fails or becomes unresponsive, the standby unit automatically assumes the active role without manual intervention .
- **Synchronization:** Configuration, policies, and session information are continuously synchronized between the primary and standby units to ensure seamless failover .
- **Cluster Interfaces:** FireCluster setups often use dedicated primary and backup interfaces for cluster communication. Using separate subnets or direct connections reduces latency and avoids additional points of failure .
