

Height requirements for temporary cable trays



Overview

When vertically installed, the height of cable trays from the ground should not be lower than 1. If the above standards cannot be met, metal covers must be added for protection. These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray cont d for instrumentation and control applications that require.
