

How long should cable trays be fitted with jumper wires



Overview

Generally, standard trays require supports every 6 to 10 feet, while heavy-duty, long-span trays can handle distances of up to 20 feet between supports. For non-galvanized cable trays, both ends of each connection plate shall be bridged with a copper jumper. In this case, you can skip the jumpers as long as the metal stays tightly bolted. NEC Article 392 defines cable tray as "a unit or assembly of units or sections and associated fittings forming a structural system used to securely fasten or support cables and raceways.
