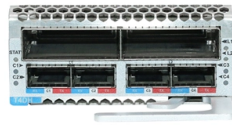


How long should the fiber optic cable be installed at the junction box

A fiber optic cable typically requires a junction box when the cable run exceeds 15 meters indoors or when protection, splicing, or distribution is needed.

When a Junction Box is Needed

Fiber optic junction boxes, also called distribution or termination boxes, are used to organize, protect, and manage fiber connections. They are essential when:

- Cable runs are long or complex: For indoor installations, most regulations allow short outdoor-rated fiber runs of 2–15 meters inside a building. Beyond this, a junction box or conduit is recommended to protect the cable and facilitate splicing or termination .
- Splicing or splitting is required: Junction boxes provide a secure location for fusion splices, mechanical connectors, or optical splitters, ensuring minimal signal loss and easy maintenance .
- Environmental protection is needed: Boxes shield fibers from physical damage, dust, moisture, and temperature fluctuations, especially in industrial or outdoor-adjacent areas .
- Future expansion or network management: Junction boxes allow for additional fibers or upgrades without re-routing the entire cable .
