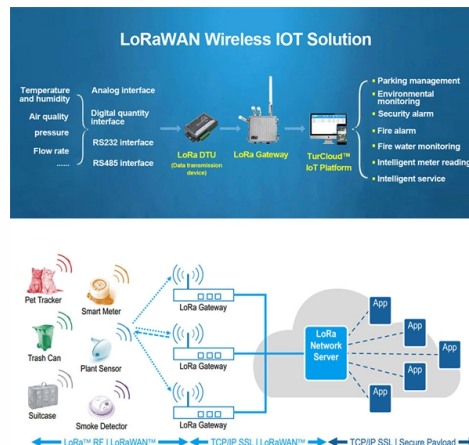


How long should the fiber optic cable drop wire be



Summary of Content

Fiber optic drop wires should be long enough to reach the subscriber's premises with 30–50 cm of slack at the termination point, while respecting maximum span limits and routing constraints.

Key Considerations for Drop Wire Length

Slack at Termination: Always reserve 30–50 centimeters of slack at the ONT or termination point to allow for re-termination, maintenance, or future upgrades without stressing the fiber cable . **Maximum Span:** For aerial installations using messenger-supported figure-8 cables, the maximum span between supports is typically 50 meters (164 ft) under standard conditions, with specialized designs allowing spans up to 80 meters depending on messenger material and local climate . **Routing Path:** Plan the cable path to avoid tight bends, sharp corners, and unsupported long spans. Use gentle curves and avoid mechanical stress points to minimize signal loss and prevent fiber damage . **Outdoor Protection:** For outdoor runs, use UV-resistant jackets and secure the cable with appropriate clamps or ties. Conduits or sleeves should be used when passing through walls or floors to prevent abrasion . **Indoor Routing:** Inside buildings, fiber drop cables should be flexible and capable of handling tight bends, especially around corners or within ONT enclosures. Bend-insensitive fibers like G.657.A2 are recommended for these scenarios . **Installation Practices:** Ensure the cable is long enough to accommodate the entire route without tension. Avoid pulling the cable too tightly, exceeding bend radius limits, or twisting the fiber, as these can cause immediate or long-term damage .
