Factors Affecting Cable Length

- **Network Speed:** Higher-speed networks (10G, 40G, 100G) reduce the maximum distance for multimode fibers. For example, OM1 supports only 33 meters at 10GBASE-SR, while OM3 can reach 300 meters .
