Pure Fiber Optic Cables

Small optical fiber communication cables are primarily composed of glass or plastic fibers that transmit data using light signals. The absence of copper provides several advantages: immunity to electromagnetic interference, electrical isolation, enhanced security, and the ability to transmit data over long distances at very high bandwidths without signal degradation .
