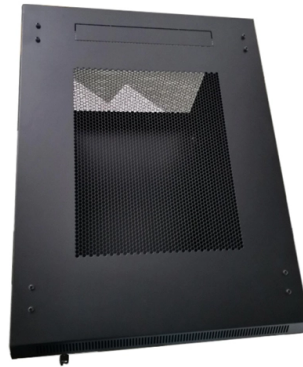


How to connect the pigtail to the terminal box

To connect a pigtail to a terminal box, twist the circuit wires together with a short pigtail wire using a wire nut, then attach the free end of the pigtail to the device terminal, ensuring proper color coding and secure connections.

Step-by-Step Process

1. Safety First Before starting, turn off the power at the breaker and verify that the wires are de-energized using a non-contact voltage tester. Wear safety glasses and insulated gloves to protect yourself during the process . 2. Prepare the Wires Cut a pigtail wire about 6-8 inches long. Strip $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ inch of insulation from the ends of the pigtail and the circuit wires (hot, neutral, and ground). Ensure the stripped ends are even for a reliable connection . 3. Create the Splice Align the stripped ends of the incoming and outgoing circuit wires with the pigtail wire. Twist them together clockwise and secure them with a properly sized wire nut. The wire nut should fully cover the exposed copper, and a gentle tug on each wire confirms a secure connection . 4. Connect to the Terminal Box

- Hot wire (black or red): Attach the pigtail to the brass-colored screw terminal.
- Neutral wire (white): Attach the pigtail to the silver-colored screw terminal.
