

How to splice pigtails to cables

Step-by-Step Splicing Process

- Prepare the Cable: Carefully remove the outer jacket of the incoming fiber cable to expose the individual fibers. Strip the protective coating from the fiber using a fiber stripper. Clean the exposed fiber with alcohol wipes until it is free of debris .
- Prepare the Pigtail: Slide a heat-shrink splice protection sleeve onto the pigtail before splicing. Strip and clean the bare fiber end of the pigtail in the same manner as the main cable .
