Purpose of a Pull Box

A pull box, also called a pull-out terminal box, is an electrical enclosure designed to allow wires to be pulled through conduit systems without splicing inside the box. Unlike junction boxes, pull boxes do not contain permanent wire connections; their primary function is to reduce tension and friction on conductors during installation, especially in long or complex conduit runs with multiple bends. They also provide access points for maintenance, cable re-routing, and future upgrades.

Types of Pull Boxes

- Straight Pull Boxes: Conduits enter opposite sides, allowing wires to pass straight through.
- Angle Pull Boxes: Wires enter at a right angle to the exit side.
- U-Pull Boxes: Wires enter and exit from the same side, forming a U-shaped path.

Sizing Requirements

Pull box sizing is governed by NEC Article 314.28, particularly for conductors 4 AWG and larger. The minimum box dimensions depend on the type of pull:

- Straight Pull: Box length must be at least 8 times the trade diameter of the largest conduit entering the box.
