

Jumper pigtail fiber

A fiber optic jumper has connectors on both ends for active connections, while a pigtail has a connector on only one end and is designed for fusion splicing.

Fiber Optic Jumper (Patch Cord)

A jumper fiber, also called a patch cord, is a pre-terminated fiber optic cable with connectors on both ends. It is used to establish active connections between devices, such as connecting optical transceivers to terminal boxes or cross-connects in data centers. Jumpers typically have a thicker protective layer to withstand handling and routing, and they come in single-mode (yellow, 1310nm/1550nm, long-distance) and multi-mode (orange or lake blue, 850nm, short-distance) variants. Common connector types include LC, SC, ST, and FC, chosen based on the equipment interface.

Fiber Optic Pigtail

A pigtail fiber is a short fiber with a connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The bare end is designed for fusion splicing to a main fiber optic cable inside an optical distribution frame (ODF), terminal box, or closure. Pigtails are not directly connected to equipment; instead, they create a low-loss, serviceable interface between the main cable and patch cords. Factory-polished connectors on pigtails ensure precise alignment and minimal signal loss, which is difficult to achieve with field-terminated fibers.
