Purpose of the Hole

Common Issues

Over time, plastic or old electrical boxes may develop stripped or loose holes, especially in old work boxes or after repeated installations. This can cause the switch to wobble or fail to stay securely mounted, which is both inconvenient and potentially unsafe.

Repair Methods

- **G-Clips or F-Clips:** These are metal clips that fit into the stripped hole and provide a new threaded surface for the screw, allowing the switch to be securely mounted without replacing the box .
- **Epoxy or Plastic Filler:** For minor damage, filling the hole with epoxy or a plastic repair compound can restore the threads and allow screws to hold firmly .
