The Local Fiber Optic Connector, commonly known as the LC connector, is a small form-factor fiber optic connector widely used for high-density networking applications.

Overview

The LC connector (short for Lucent Connector, Little Connector, or Local Connector) was developed by Lucent Technologies in 1994 and became commercially available by 1996, with standards ratified in 1999 . It features a 1.25mm ferrule, which is half the size of traditional SC, ST, or FC connectors, making it ideal for high-density applications such as data centers, SFP/SFP+ transceivers, LANs, and enterprise networks . The connector uses a push-pull latch mechanism that ensures secure, pull-proof connections while allowing easy disconnection .

Key Features

- **Small Form Factor (SFF):** Compact design allows more ports per panel, optimizing space in high-density environments .
- **Ferrule Material:** Typically made of zirconia, providing precise alignment and low insertion loss .
- **Duplex and Simplex Options:** LC connectors are available in simplex (single fiber) and duplex (paired fibers with clips) configurations .
- **Color Coding:** Standard colors indicate fiber type and polish: blue for single-mode UPC, green for single-mode APC, and beige or black for multimode .
