Panel Capacity and Physical Limitations

A primary distribution box, such as a 200-amp residential panel, serves as the central hub for distributing electricity to all branch circuits in a building. The maximum number of circuits is determined primarily by the physical design of the panel, including the number of breaker slots and the bus bar connection points. Standard panels usually have 30 to 42 slots, each accommodating a single-pole breaker for 120V circuits or half of a double-pole breaker for 240V circuits. Double-pole breakers occupy two adjacent slots, reducing the total number of circuits that can be installed.

Expanding Circuit Capacity

To increase the number of branch circuits beyond the standard slot limitation, tandem or slimline breakers can be used. These breakers allow two separate circuits to occupy a single physical slot, effectively doubling the number of 120V circuits in the panel. This is particularly useful in homes with high electrical demand or when adding new appliances, EV chargers, or solar inverters.
