An outdoor optical cable conduit is a protective tube or duct installed outdoors to house and safeguard fiber optic cables from environmental and mechanical damage.

Definition and Purpose

An outdoor optical cable conduit—also called a duct—is a tubular structure, typically made of durable plastic or other weather-resistant materials, designed to protect fiber optic cables when installed outside. These conduits shield the cables from moisture, temperature extremes, UV radiation, soil pressure, rodents, and physical stress while providing a controlled pathway for cable deployment .

Installation Methods

Outdoor conduits are usually buried underground at depths of 1-2 meters to prevent accidental damage from digging or environmental hazards . Fiber optic cables can be installed inside the conduit using several techniques:

- Air-blowing or jetting: Cables are propelled through the conduit using compressed air .
- Pulling or pushing: Cables are manually or mechanically pulled through the conduit.
- Microducts: Smaller conduits subdivide the main duct into compartments for micro cables, allowing flexible and scalable installations .
