It includes a central fiber flanked by reinforcing elements and is wrapped in a protective sheath, often low-smoke halogen-free, to provide mechanical protection and durability for indoor wiring. Leather fibers are designed for specific applications where enhanced mechanical strength and safety are required, such as access networks.

Key Differences

- Connectorization: Pigtails have a connector on one end; leather fibers are typically unconnectorized or used as reinforced jumpers .
- Structure: Pigtails are simple short fibers for splicing; leather fibers have a reinforced figure-eight design for mechanical protection .
