Bonding all metallic components ensures they remain at the same electrical potential, reducing the risk of dangerous voltage differences.

Regulatory Requirements

According to the National Electrical Code (NEC):

- NEC 314.28: Metal boxes must be reliably grounded and bonded.
 - NEC 110.26: Ensures safe access to equipment doors without obstruction.
 - NEC 250.122: Specifies minimum sizes for equipment grounding conductors, though larger conductors are recommended for improved safety and power quality.
- Non-metallic boxes generally do not require grounding unless they have metallic frames or hinges.
