

Requirements for horizontal embedding of cable tray supports



Overview

The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. For licensed electricians, mastering these principles is essential. NEC Article 392 outlines the key rules for installing and maintaining industrial cable tray systems. Strength: Supports should be designed to handle the maximum load capacity of trays including cables, with a safety factor. Corrosion protection: Hot-dip. us-trations without notice.
