Weatherproofing Considerations

Roof Penetrations

When cables exit a tray and penetrate the roof, it is critical to seal the individual cables or the tray opening to maintain the integrity of the building envelope . This can be achieved by constructing a small enclosure or “doghouse” around the penetration, or by using gooseneck-style conduits to direct water away from the opening . Proper sealing ensures that water does not enter the cable tray system or the building interior.
