Core Switch Overview

A core switch is a high-capacity, high-performance Layer 3 switch that forms the backbone of an enterprise network, aggregating traffic from distribution switches and providing ultra-low latency and maximum throughput . It is optimized for routing between VLANs, subnets, and security zones, and often deployed in high-availability pairs using protocols like HSRP or VRRP to ensure continuous network operation . Core switches handle massive data volumes and are critical for maintaining network performance and reliability.

Best Practices for Router Connection

When connecting a router to a core switch, there are two main approaches:

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Routed Port (Preferred)

- Configure the switch port as a Layer 3 interface (no switchport) and assign an IP address.
- This eliminates Layer 2 protocols like STP on the link, reducing potential loops and latency .
- Ideal for direct router-to-core switch connections, especially in large networks where performance and simplicity are critical.
