

Safety Precautions During Optical Cable Splicing

Ensuring safety during optical cable splicing requires proper PPE, careful handling of fibers, laser precautions, adherence to cable installation limits, and safe disposal of fiber scraps.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Technicians must wear protective glasses or face shields to prevent eye injuries from glass fragments or laser exposure, gloves (nitrile or latex) to avoid cuts from sharp fibers, and durable workwear or aprons to protect skin and clothing from fiber particles and chemicals. In noisy environments, hearing protection is recommended when using splicing machines or cleavers .

Handling Fiber Optic Cables

- Avoid excessive bending: Always respect the cable's minimum bend radius to prevent internal fiber breaks and signal loss .
- Proper cable management: Secure and route cables neatly to prevent tangling, stress, or accidental damage .
- Pulling and tension limits: Do not exceed the cable's specified pulling tension; use swivel grips and compatible lubricants to reduce stress during installation .
- Twisting precautions: Use anti-twisting devices to prevent torsion damage during cable pulling .
