Vertical trays maintain cable integrity over long distances and are commonly used in multi-story buildings or industrial plants .

Installation Considerations

- **Accessibility:** Trays should be installed so that cables are easily accessible for inspection, maintenance, and future expansion, with recommended clearances of at least 300 mm above or between systems .
