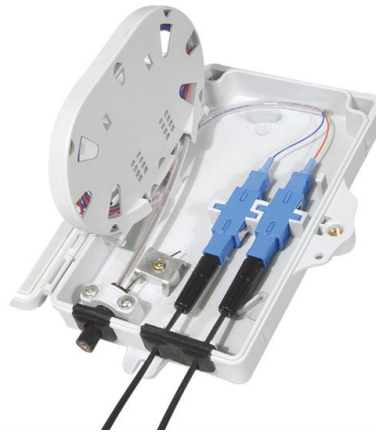


Should cables be run in cable trays or conduits

Cable trays are open structural systems designed to support and manage multiple cables along a pathway. They are ideal for large buildings, factories, or data centers where numerous cables need to be installed and maintained. Key advantages include:

- Ease of installation and maintenance: Cables can be laid directly onto trays without threading, allowing quick additions or repairs .
- Heat dissipation: Open design allows air circulation, reducing the risk of overheating .
- Cost-effectiveness: Fewer fittings, supports, and labor requirements make trays cheaper for large-scale projects .
- Scalability: Trays accommodate future expansion easily, supporting additional cables without major modifications . Cable trays are particularly suitable for main distribution routes, long corridors, risers, and data backbones. They can also be used in fire-rated areas if fire-rated trays and cables are employed .
