Conduits also help maintain proper bend radius and prevent kinking during installation, which is critical for high-fiber-count cables.

When Conduits Are Recommended

- Urban or high-traffic areas: To protect against accidental digging or construction damage.
- Long-term network flexibility: Conduits allow for easier cable replacement or upgrades without additional excavation.
