

# Solutions for Loose Fiber Optic Pigtails

- **Use High-Quality Tools:** Ensure your fusion splicer, cleaver, and cleaning tools are clean and in good condition. Dust or dull blades can compromise the splice quality.
- **Perform Fusion Splicing:** Align the bare fiber end of the pigtail with the incoming fiber and perform a fusion splice. Loose pigtails may require careful handling to maintain fiber alignment during the splice.
