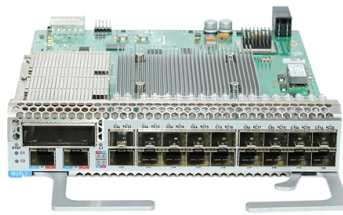


Standard requirements for maintenance spacing of distribution boxes



Summary of Content

Minimum maintenance clearances for distribution boxes typically require 3 feet in front, 30 inches at the sides, and 6½ feet of headroom, with additional considerations for high-voltage or large equipment.

Front Clearance

A minimum of 3 feet (approximately 0.9 meters) of clear space must be maintained in front of all distribution boxes, panelboards, switchgear, and transformers to allow safe access for maintenance, inspection, and emergency operations. Doors and panels must be able to open at least 90 degrees without obstruction, ensuring personnel can safely work or move away in case of an incident .

Side Clearance

The side-to-side working space should be at least 30 inches (0.76 meters) or the width of the equipment, whichever is greater. This ensures safe lateral access for adjustments, inspections, and emergency interventions .

Height Clearance

The minimum headroom in front of the equipment should be 6½ feet (2 meters) or the height of the equipment, whichever is greater. This clearance prevents personnel from being trapped and allows safe movement around the equipment .
