Why Neutral and Ground Must Be Separated Downstream

The neutral wire carries return current from electrical devices under normal operation, completing the circuit back to the power source, while the ground wire is a safety conductor designed to carry current only during a fault to prevent electric shock or fire. When neutral and ground are connected together in a distribution box or subpanel, the ground wire can carry normal operating current, creating a parallel path for return current. This can energize metal enclosures, conduits, or other grounded components, posing a shock hazard.

Hazards of Connecting Neutral and Ground in a Subpanel

- **Shock Risk:** Metal parts that should be safe to touch may become energized because neutral current flows through the grounding system.
- **Fire Risk:** Grounding conductors are not sized for continuous current; if they carry neutral current, they can overheat and damage insulation, potentially causing fire.
- **Fault Protection Compromise:** During a ground fault, current may bypass the intended path, delaying breaker tripping and reducing protection effectiveness.
- **Equipment Malfunction:** Sensitive devices, including smart home equipment, may malfunction due to voltage drops or interference caused by shared neutral-ground paths.
