

The optical module pull ring can't be pulled out



Summary of Content

Do not force the optical module; first unplug the fiber, then carefully open the pull ring or latch before pulling the module out horizontally to avoid damage.

Step-by-Step Guidance

1. Disconnect the Fiber Jumper Before attempting to remove the module, unplug all connected optical fibers. This prevents stress on the module and avoids contamination of the optical path. Cover the fiber ends with dust caps to protect them from dust and debris . 2. Check the Pull Ring or Latch Most SFP and QSFP modules have a pull ring or tab that must be flipped or pressed to release the internal locking mechanism. If the pull ring is stuck:

- Ensure it is fully flipped open or pressed down.
- If it is blocked, use a small flathead screwdriver or narrow tool to gently lift or disengage the latch without applying excessive force . 3. Pull the Module Horizontally Once the pull ring is properly released, pull the module straight out at a horizontal angle. Avoid twisting, bending, or pulling at an angle, as this can deform the host's internal locking spring or damage the module . 4. Handle Stubborn Modules If the module still cannot be removed:
- Double-check that the fiber is fully disconnected.
- Confirm that the pull ring or latch is completely disengaged.
- Avoid forcing the module; repeated attempts with gentle pressure are safer than applying excessive force . 5. After Removal
